Types of Seeds Collecting: Open pollinated seed and native species for the midwest region particularly Minnesota.

Requirements for seeds shared with the library: We prefer seeds that have been grown to organic standards, primarily not using pesticides, fungicides, or herbicides .

Where seeds are distributed to: In 2020, seed shared to St. Paul Seed Circle will be redirected into the Midway, Frogtown and Rondo and nearby St Paul neighborhoods to individuals and community growing spaces. Native plants will be grown out with community help for Pierce Butler Meadow space, to increase the diversity of species.

Name of the Seed Library: **White Bear Lake Seed Library**

Types of Seeds Collecting: Tomato, peas, beans, lettuce and native plants

Requirements for seeds shared with the library: Seeds must be open-pollinated varieties or true native plants, no cultivars. Seeds should not have been cross-pollinated.
